- Enlistment Into The Royal 22 Oct 1904 in Portsmouth, Hampshire, England; Signed up for 12 years. Serving 6 mths training aboard HMS Nelson, a training ship. In 1906 he served on HMS Euryalus (a Cressey class armoured Cruiser) and in 1905 on HMS Royal Arthur (a shore establishment).
- Military Service: 21 Dec 1909 in England; Saw Alfred finishing another spell of training with HMS Victory II, before joining HMS Fishguard in Pembrokeshire for further training.
- Residence: 02 Apr 1911 ; Alfred was serving on HMS Leda (a Minesweeper) until 21 April 1912 (I would imagine he'd be aboard her on the night the 1911 Census was taken.)
- Military Service: 22 Apr 1912 in England; Saw the end of another spell of training on HMS Victory II, followed by time aboard HMS Crescent (a 1st class cruiser) HMS Orontes (a depot ship) and HMS Egmont (a ironclad steam propelled warship).
- Military Service: 15 Nov 1913 in England; Another period of 3 mths training aboard HMS Victory II, before joining HMS Argonaut, a Diadem class armored destroyer.
- Military Service: 30 Apr 1914 in England; Another 2wk training period aboard HMS Victory II, before joining HMS Bristol (a wooden Screw Frigate)
- Military Service: 18 Dec 1915 in England; Another period of 2 Wks training aboard HMS Victory II, before joining HMS Vernon for Torpedo Training.
- Military Service: 04 Feb 1916 in England; Finishes another training period aboard HMS Victory II to join HMS Vernon, doing Torpedo training.
- Military Service: 02 Oct 1917 in England; Alfred joined the Mary Rose just 2 weeks before the attack in the North Sea. Having spent another two months training aboard HMS Victory II.
- Death: 17 Oct 1917 in North Sea, off Norway; Cause of Death: Killed/died as a direct result of enemy action. Ship: HMS Mary Rose. Location of Grave: Not recorded Name/Address of Cemetery: Body Not Recovered For Burial Relatives Notified and Address: Mother: Ann Eliza, 73 Chapel St, Newhaven
